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2023 HIGHLIGHTS

WE ADVOCATED FOR WHAT IS RIGHT

In 2019, changes to Michigan's auto insurance law slashed reimbursement rates for catastrophic care by nearly 50%, severely impacting survivors and providers like Origami. Despite bipartisan support, Senate Bills 530, 531, and 575, crucial for addressing this crisis, have stalled in the House after passing the Senate. Our advocacy efforts in 2023 included rallying at the Capitol with organizations like the Coalition Protecting Auto No-Fault, the Michigan Brain Injury Provider Council, and We Can't Wait, and testifying before relevant committees. Passage of these bills is vital to end Michigan's catastrophic care crisis.

Our President & CEO, Tammy Hannah, testified to the Senate Committee on Insurance, Finance, and Consumer Protection and the Michigan House of Representatives Committee on Insurance and Financial Services. She was also one of the speakers who shared testimony at the rally at the Capitol.

- High level employee satisfaction with 95% indicating they would recommend Origami as an enjoyable and fulfilling place to work















INSPIRING EXCELLENCE

IZZO LEGACY RUN/WALK/ROLL


