



ORIGAMI IS ACCREDITED THROUGH THE COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION OF REHABILITATION FACILITIES (CARF). DURING ORIGAMI'S MOST RECENT CARF SURVEY, THE SURVEY TEAM IDENTIFIED THE FOLLOWING STRENGTHS:

- Led by a skilled, passionate leadership team deeply committed to the mission. Leaders are accessible to persons served, families, and team members, and actively seek input to improve systems and practices.
- Leadership involvement in national, regional, and local brain injury organizations and networks, elevating advocacy and awareness for persons served.
- Strong emphasis on professional development and continuing education, resulting in multiple subspecialized therapists capable of delivering highly specialized services.
- Demonstrated resilience and strategic leadership in response to significant statewide changes in brain injury funding, while maintaining mission and vision.
- Main campus located on expansive acreage that supports outdoor therapeutic activities, walking trails, and engagement with nature. Facilities are clean, updated, and filled with natural light.
- Use of Microsoft Teams channels for each person served to promote efficient communication and strong interdisciplinary collaboration.
- Innovative stakeholder engagement tools, including the staff 'Think Tank' and a child-friendly pediatric survey using visuals, with feedback clearly integrated into program improvement.
- Access to external subspecialists such as neuro-optometry, enhancing breadth and quality of brain injury services.
- Successful integration of newly acquired locations while preserving Origami's culture, mission, and clinical excellence, despite differences in populations and service focus.
- Availability of a full-time psychiatrist specializing in neurological disorders, a rare and significant strength among outpatient and residential rehabilitation programs.
- Comprehensive driving training program with multiple vehicles and adaptive options, including Michigan's first driving program specifically for adolescents.
- Extensive clinical affiliations with local and regional universities across disciplines, supporting workforce development, recruitment, shared resources, and the exchange of best practices.
- Development of Origami Greenlawn Outpatient Services in an underserved and economically disadvantaged area, fostering partnerships within a nonprofit hub and supporting community-based advocacy and collaboration.
