IN 2025 THE NEED GREW. AND ORIGAMI GREW ALONGSIDE IT.

As we reflect on 2025, one truth stands out clearly: the need for specialized rehabilitation services across our communities continues to grow. More individuals and families are searching for answers, healing, independence, and hope during some of life's most challenging moments.

At Origami Rehabilitation, we believe every person deserves access to exceptional, specialized care. And when the need grows, so do we.

Growth at Origami has never been about numbers alone. It has always been about people, individuals rebuilding their lives after injury or illness, families navigating uncertainty, and a team that shows up each day committed to meeting clients exactly where they are.

This year marked the most significant growth in Origami's history, doubling our size by adding two outpatient clinics that expanded access to care, allowing more individuals and families to receive the specialized rehabilitation services they deserve closer to home.

Because of this growth, our impact reached record levels. In 2025, we admitted 1,430 clients and served 2,156 individuals across our continuum of care. Our team delivered 41,971 therapy sessions and expanded our reach across 72 counties. Most importantly, these numbers represent transformed lives. They represent individuals achieving greater independence, families finding support during difficult seasons, and communities strengthened through accessible, high-quality rehabilitation services.

While growth expanded our reach, our purpose remained steadfast. Whether supporting someone returning to work, helping a child reach developmental milestones, or guiding a family through recovery after a traumatic injury, our team remains deeply committed to individualized, person-centered care.

None of this work happens alone. Origami's impact is made possible through the trust and support of our clients, families, community partners, donors, volunteers, and, most importantly, our extraordinary team members.

As we look toward the future, our mission continues to guide us. We remain focused on removing barriers to care, expanding access to specialized rehabilitation services, and helping every individual unfold what is possible.

Origami Rehabilitation was founded through the visionary partnership of Peckham, Inc. and the Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine. This collaboration created a unique model of care that integrates medical expertise, rehabilitation, community re-entry, return-to-work, and driver rehabilitation. Today, leaders from both organizations continue to serve on our Board of Directors, ensuring Origami remains rooted in excellence, innovation, and community impact.



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DOUBLING OUR IMPACT. EXPANDING ACCESS TO CARE.

In January 2025, Origami doubled its locations, expanding access to specialized rehabilitation services across mid-Michigan and beyond.

On January 27, 2025, Origami opened the doors to Origami Greenlawn, our third Lansing location. Situated within the Child and Family Charities Nonprofit Hub, this collaborative space brings together trusted community organizations, making it easier for families to access rehabilitation, mental health, housing, and supportive services in one centralized location.

Designed to reduce barriers and strengthen community partnerships, Greenlawn expands access to specialized care for children and adults across the tri-county area. Conveniently located along a CATA bus route and with increased services for individuals eligible for Medicaid and other funding sources, this location ensures care is not only available but also accessible.

On January 1, 2025, Origami expanded into Genesee County through the acquisition of Strength Training and Recovery Corporation (STAR Rehab), establishing Origami East as our fourth location. By retaining the entire experienced clinical team, this transition builds upon more than 20 years of trusted, innovative neurorehabilitation and orthopedic care in the community.

Now strengthened by Origami's specialized expertise and comprehensive continuum of services, Origami East expands access to advanced, person-centered rehabilitation, ensuring individuals and families in Genesee County can receive high-quality care close to home.



With four locations across Mason, West Lansing, South Lansing, and Grand Blanc, Origami continues to ensure that geography is never a barrier to healing, because when need grows, access must grow with it.




2025 HIGHLIGHTS CONTINUED



- Delivered 70+ professional presentations statewide, nearly doubling 2024 outreach, along with 20 clinically focused facility tours.
- Expanded specialty rehabilitation services in Grand Blanc and South Lansing, adding specialized services in vision, vestibular, feeding, dysphagia, sensory integration, and functional cognitive therapy.
- Supported professional development with advanced certifications across brain injury care, stroke rehab, driving rehab, speech and swallowing, therapeutic techniques, and leadership, including 70% of eligible clinicians maintaining Certified Brain Injury Specialist (CBIS) certification.
- Received a \$25,000 General Motors grant to enhance our Driver Rehabilitation service, helping clients regain independence and drive safely.
- Origami clinicians contributed to the 8th chapter on Visual Perceptual Assessments and Intervention in the upcoming 9th edition of Occupational Therapy for Physical Dysfunction, a key OT education resource.
- Celebrated 28 years of service, creating opportunities, transforming lives, and helping clients.
- Selected as a Charity of Choice for the Izzo Legacy Run/Walk/Roll.
- Featured 130+ times in local media.
- Raised \$928,773 through fundraising to sustain and expand our mission.
- Expanded community reach through targeted outreach to 2,000+ households and 1,100+ referral touchpoints, while integrating and rebranding four locations to strengthen regional access to care.
- Achieved 97% employee satisfaction, with staff recommending Origami as a fulfilling and enjoyable workplace.
- Provided 65+ hands-on learning opportunities through 31 internships and 34 shadow experiences.

FINDING HIS VOICE TEDDY'S STORY



Five-year-old Teddy is full of curiosity, joy, and personality. Born with Down syndrome, he began speech therapy at just four months old. Though he doesn't use many words yet, Teddy communicates through gestures, signs, and a smile that lights up every room.

To help him express himself, Teddy uses an iPad program called Proloquo2Go, lovingly known as his "talker." When he started school, his mom wanted extra support beyond the classroom. Having brought Teddy's older sister to Origami before, she knew this was the right place to turn.

Teddy's speech-language pathologist at Origami learned his school program so therapy, home, and school could all align. The results have been life-changing. Therapy sessions at Origami are filled with songs, games, and laughter. Each week, Teddy grows in confidence, proudly using his "talker" to show how much he understands.

All of our clients, including Teddy, inspire us; their resilience, joy, and determination are the reasons we are excited to do this work each morning, eager to continue breaking down barriers to care and to continue being a guide and partner on rehabilitation journeys.
