ADMISSION ELIGIBILITY

- Be episode free of seizures or any other condition change in mental status that may affect driving for a period of 6 months (for Behind-the-Wheel training)
- Have a valid driver's license permit (for Behind-the-Wheel training)
- Michigan residents with a suspended license may be eligible for a temporary instruction permit

CLINICAL ASSESSMENT

Skills that are clinically assessed include:

- Reaction Time
- Visual Scanning
- Gross and Fine Motor Coordination
- Attention
- Information Processing Speeds
- Executive Functions

Functional scenarios that are assessed include:

- Lane Keeping and Changing
- Making Left and Right Turns
- Maintaining Speed
- Recognizing and Responding to Hazards
- Obeying Traffic Signs and Rules of the Road
- Naturalistic Drives
